H&S Legislation NOT a Barrier to Practicals or Fieldwork

At a worrying time when 171 people died at work last year, but David Cameron has pledged to "kill off the health and safety culture for good", we welcome the government response to the House of Commons Science and Technology Select Committee report on what schools and colleges need to do to overcome the perceived and real barriers to providing practicals and fieldwork opportunities.

As we expected, despite Cameron's appalling and unhelpful description of workplace health and safety as a "monster", no evidence that health and safety legislation itself prevents practicals and field trips was found. However, the report does acknowledge that perceived health and safety concerns and the amount of paperwork expected by some schools particularly in planning excursions could deter staff. This is something we at KAHSC are keen to tackle together with you. The head of policy and public affairs, at IOSH, Richard Jones agrees



that "the problem identified by the Government's own reviews is not the law, but rather, exaggerated fear of being sued, fed by aggressive marketing". It is only fed further by headlines like "Science Teacher Sets Herself on Fire and Burns Face of Boy, Six" (Daily Mail 1/12/11) rather than "Milton Keynes School Fire Leaves Woman and Boy Injured" (BBC 1/12/11) as just one recent example.

DfE confirmation that educational settings need only a single consent from parents for all trips of every kind is a good first step in reducing burdens on staff wanting to get pupils learning outside the classroom. The renewed focus on recording only the most significant risks in risk assessment is also warmly welcomed. DfE Finally Acts Against littlegossip Website

Most read with horror about this website that allows users to post gossip anonymously about educational institutions, including threats, sexual abuse, racial slurs and other forms of abuse. The site was created by a British teenager to emulate the popular TV series 'Gossip Girl'. Following uproar last year the site shut down, but reopened 24hrs later with an 'I am over 18' tick box, but with many school groups still registered!


Several Head teachers and Principals have been so concerned they have referred postings to the Police, one after threats were made to rape a teacher.

The DfE has now contacted the Dutch Ministry of Education, as the site is hosted in Holland, where the Cyber Security and Incident Response Team is investigating.

Schools should not sit back and rest easy though. Cyber-bullying is a serious and growing issue and schools must take reasonable steps to protect staff and pupils. As a minimum there should be a clear e-safety policy in place, regular dialogue with parents and pupils on the risks of social-media sites and signed 'acceptable use' of technology policies.


Is one or more of the 3 phases in your electrical system overloaded?

More than one school has recently been concerned by a faint smell of burning in the area of their mains electricity meter and switchboard. The electricians called in to investigate discovered that part of the board had melted apparently because 1 out of the 3 phases was significantly overloaded in comparison with the other 2. This is something that should not happen in the first place when work is carried out by competent contractors and is unfortunately not something that would normally be picked up on your Periodic Inspection of the Fixed Electrical Installation (every 5 years or sooner as recommended by your electrician).

When premises are built some complex and careful calculations ensure the electrical demand or 'loading' is usually divided relatively evenly across the 3 phase system. When it is added to in the future for a new wing or classroom perhaps or a dedicated IT suite, electrical installers should be carefully calculating to ensure that they do not overload any one phase with the new demand. Had significant works done? Wondering if the first you'll know about a problem will be that faint smell of burning?

Ask whichever registered contractor carries out your Fixed Electrical Installation Test to tell you if your premises might be at risk.

Is Your Minibus verwe



Drivers who passed their test before 1 Jan 1997 with D1+E still on their current licence can drive a minibus with up to 17 seats (inc. driver) and can tow a trailer that weighs more than 750kg. Total minibus and trailer weight must never exceed 12 tonnes and the fully laden trailer must never weigh more than the unladen minibus. If you have a photocard driving licence, at renewal you must apply separately to renew the D1+E entitlement and meet higher medical standards or you will lose it.

Drivers who passed their test after 1 Jan 1997 will not have D1 on their licence and may only drive a minibus weighing no more than 3.5 tonnes (4.25 when adapted for the disabled) if they:

- Are over 21
- Have held their full car (B) licence for 2 years
- Are not paid for doing so and
- The vehicle is used for social purposes by a non-commercial body but not for hire or reward.

These drivers may not ever tow any kind of trailer at all.

Notable Accidents

Roofer injured at Stockport school 22 July 2011

Ploughcroft Building Services fined £10,000 and pays £11,000 costs after employee injured back and neck tripping on cables and falling through roof at Stockport school. They failed to provide a cover or barrier for the skylight, despite being told to by a health and safety consultant less than six weeks earlier. There were children walking under the skylight just minutes before he fell through it.

Independent school fined over loft fall 26 July 2011

Kimbolton School fined £6,000 and pays £2,300 costs after a Pool Attendant was injured falling from a loft space to the swimming pool changing rooms below. She and the Pool Manager were retrieving paperwork stored there when she lost her footing walking along a beam across the unboarded roof space. She fell 2.5m to the tiled floor below narrowly missing a benched area. School left the surface fragile and did not have a risk assessment for entering there. HSE questioned why still needed documents were stored there at all.

HSE censures Greenwich Hospital after pupil injured at Suffolk school 8 April 2011

Highest penalty possible for Crown Institutions, HSE Censure, issued for Royal Hospital School. During a PE climbing wall class a pupil fell 6m in an uncontrolled descent from the top of the wall to a wood gymnasium floor below fracturing her spine. School admitted "risk assessments, operating procedures and inspection/maintenance regimes were not suitable or sufficient" and that "unserviceable equipment was mixed with usable equipment, supervisors had not received refresher training and there was no monitoring or system set up for access to technical advice." HSE recognises climbing walls are important in education and encourages schools to provide them, but they must follow industry guidance.

Independent school fined after groundsmen suffer electrical burns 3 March 2011

The King's School fined £6,000 and pays £4,300 costs after 3 employees suffered electrical burns when the rugby post they were setting up on the sports field came into contact with a live 33,000 volt overhead power line. HSE identified poor management of H&S as well as failures in risk assessment, supervision and training for staff and contractors.
